EXCITING UPDATE ON THE COLEMAN OAKS THRIFT STORE & COFFEE SHOP!

Praise God! Construction is progressing well, and we're on track to start interior work after Christmas. We're aiming for an early May opening! We're grateful for your prayers and support through our "Invest in the Future" program. Your contributions have brought us closer to our goal.

We're reopening our "Investment Opportunity" to reach a new goal of \$350,000. While we met our initial construction goal, we aim to reduce our financial obligation to the landowners and create a cash flow cushion until our May opening. Details:

- We still owe \$275,000 with an 8% interest rate.
- By investing, we'll save 4% interest. That's \$12,000 a year.
- Investment packets are available in the Coleman Oaks display area next to the Sobremesa Café in the Lobby.
- Team members will be available to assist you in January.
- Investments will be accepted through April 2025.

SEEDS OF HOPE CONCERT

Lake Deaton will again host a free concert to support the 2025 Seeds of Hope Food Drive. Enjoy lively and toe-tapping music from the 19piece Villages Swing Band, under the direction of Lew Buckley. The Swing Band will play songs from the swing era, as well as hits from the 1950s and 1960s.

Seeds of Hope is a food fund and awarenessraising committee of the Wildwood Soup Kitchen and Wildwood Food Pantry. It's sole purpose is to assist both ministries in feeding and helping the community. It is staffed solely by Volunteers so all monies go directly to either buy food or keep the facilities operating.

Food is cooked at the Soup Kitchen where meals are served to those who can come or delivered to shut-ins. Snack packs are created for children for nourishment during out of school times. Food insecure families in Sumter County come to the Food Pantry to pickup much needed food on a bi-weekly basis. Both the Wildwood Soup Kitchen and the Food Pantry rely on the generosity of individuals, churches and donations to feed the hungry. Please consider donating the following essential items:

- Canned goods: meats, vegetables, fruits, soups, Spaghettios, and chili
- Non-perishable snacks: peanut butter, jelly, and granola bars
- Paper products: toilet paper and Kleenex
- Toiletries: personal hygiene items

Hello, Lake Deaton family!

I am Randy Benjamin, the chair of our Leadership Team. I have an important announcement regarding our second service on Sunday mornings.

After looking at all of the options, the Worship Team, backed by both your Ministry and Leadership Teams, has decided to change the starting time of the second service from 10:30am to **10:45am beginning Sunday, January 5, 2025**. This extra 15 minutes will help us greatly with logistics between services.

These kinds of problems are good ones to have. Back when we were coming out of COVID in 2022, we were averaging about 530 in-person attendees each weekend during our high season of January through April. Two years later, 2024's number grew to 760 people coming in our doors each weekend. And this coming high season starting next month, we are expecting that the weekly number could easily reach 820 people.

Moving the service start back 15 minutes will allow for less congestion in our parking lot as people leave the first service and others arrive for the second one. It will give our choir more time to briefly runthrough and do a sound check for the music that they will present at the service. And it will generally provide more comfortable time to transition between services.




