
# PASTOR'S CORNER

Greetings Lake Deaton Friends and Family,

Over the past couple decades, Lent has become a special season in my life. Each year I seek to reconnect with what's important in living life as a disciple of Christ.

As Christians have been doing for centuries, I try to follow the path of Jesus in the desert. The path of fasting, prayer and self-discipline. I try to give up something that is significant in my life (last year I gave up all my electronic games). I also add on things (I added times of specific and focused prayer into my weekly routine last year). One of the things that we take on as a community each year is to focus on one of the Gospels. This year we are focused on the Gospel of John.

We have planned our "through the New Testament reading" to move into the Gospel of John during our Lent Season allowing us to stay connected with our reading plan, while also focusing on the story of Christ told through the beautiful lens of the Apostle John. I hope you are finding time to read slowly through John during these days, focusing on no more than one chapter a day, that can be read deliberately and with an open spirit to hear God speak through the pages.

# SONRISE RESPIRE

## Happy Anniversary!!!

Sonrise is five years old!!!! The Sonrise Dementia Respite program opened at Lake Deaton UMC on March 1, 2021 with three participants and 14 volunteers. Within a month, we were full at 12 participants and over 20 volunteers. Today, we now have 16 participants and 42 volunteers who plan and organize our games and activities each and every week.

Sonrise Respite is a faith-based, volunteer, social program modeled after a program under the direction of the Respite For All Foundation based in Montgomery, AL. The model differs from other respite programs, as it utilizes specialty trained volunteers who work 1:1 with our participants to provide stimulating, enriching activities that encourage those suffering from dementia or other types of memory loss to enjoy socializing with others, participating in brain and physically stimulating activities, providing community support and to regain a sense of purpose and value. It also encourages the caregivers to take a much-needed break from their never-ending responsibilities to pursue self-help and self-fulfilling activities of their own.

**Sonrise Respite meets every Monday at Lake Deaton UMC from 10:00am to 2:00 pm in CR 5/6.** A nutritious hot lunch prepared on-site is served. Participants enjoy socializing with others while enjoying a variety of stimulating activities, including music and dancing, physical exercise, arts and crafts, community service projects and brain games to stimulate their memories.

The criteria for participants to join Sonrise include self-feeding and self-toileting (with minimal assistance), ability to ambulate (walkers and canes okay) and able to actively participate in social activities. Exceptions will be considered on an individual basis. There is a weekly fee of \$25, which covers the cost of supplies and food for the participants.

The first visit is free, and monthly invoices are sent to the caregivers for the number of sessions attended each month. There is a waiting list, and if the first visit goes well, the participant is added to the waiting list and is invited to join the program when an opening occurs.

We also have a caregivers' support group, called Afternoon Grace, that meets on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Mondays of each month from 12:30pm to 2:00pm in CR 2. The group is led by a trained psychotherapist. There is no fee, and the caregivers do not have to have a loved one in Sonrise to attend.

We are always looking for volunteers who enjoy working with our clientele, and we also welcome donations to help support our ongoing activities and training for the volunteers.


# FINDING A RHYTHM: A Lenten Retreat for Our Church

March 5-6 | Warren Willis Camp Center

Lent invites us to pause, reflect, and realign our lives with God’s grace. In the midst of busy schedules and constant demands, creating space to listen—to God, to our own hearts, and to the Spirit—can be difficult. Our Church-Wide Lenten Retreat on March 5-6 offers an intentional opportunity to step away and be renewed.

The guiding theme of the retreat is “finding a rhythm.” Together, we will explore how God shapes us as followers of Jesus through life-giving rhythms in five key areas: body, mind, spirit, community, and service. Rather than striving for quick fixes, this retreat invites attentiveness—learning how to cooperate with the steady, loving work of God’s Spirit in everyday life. The retreat will include worship, short teaching sessions, guided time with the Lord, and meaningful conversation in small-group settings. Participants will spend significant time in personal reflection using guided exercises, along with shared meals, moments of rest, and opportunities to enjoy the peaceful surroundings of the camp.

This retreat is for everyone—whether you feel spiritually energized or weary, whether this is your first retreat or one of many. The hope is that you will leave with clarity about one or two rhythms God may be inviting you to embrace in the next season of life. Our time together will conclude with worship and Communion, sending us forth grounded in grace and hope.
