Greetings Lake Deaton Family & Friends,





Fresh Water Wells



### APRIL'S MOMENT FOR MISSION: "CONGO PARTNERSHIP"

The United Methodist Church has numerous mission stations throughout the remote villages of Central Congo. These villages are in need of fresh water because people suffer from a variety of diseases due to bacteria infected river water used for bathing, washing, drinking, and fishing.

Fresh water is imperative for the health of all people and a basic human need.

With the goal to dig a new well each year, these remote villages will have water that will significantly reduce river diseases, and other medical problems. For more information click <u>HERE</u>. LDUMC Congo partnership provides support for agriculture and nutrition programs and the digging of freshwater wells in the remote poverty-stricken areas of central Congo. Our last visit there was in 2023, but this past year (2024), due to major floods making roads impassable, we were unable to visit various mission sites. We look forward to visiting the area this year.

Since 2018, 27 freshwater wells were dug in central Congo, a province of 1.9 million people. Six of those wells have been funded by Lake Deaton UMC. In 2023 our church delivered 13 suitcases of sewing and cooking materials to this area as well as two grain grinders.

#### INVOLVEMENT:

- 27 freshwater wells funded (all churches).
- 6 freshwater wells were funded by LDUMC.
- In 2023 13 suitcases of sewing and cooking materials were donated by LDUMC.
- 2 grain grinders for the farm were purchased by LDUMC.

#### For LDUMC's Art Extravaganza!

We are inviting you to be part of an art sale at Lake Deaton UMC in October 2025. One hundred percent of the proceeds will go to empower young people to become selfsufficient through a ministry called ZOE Empowers.

Be part of the art extravaganza to be held at Lake Deaton UMC, where your art can be displayed and sold with the goal of raising funds to sponsor another two ZOE households representing 80–100 young children.



## **ZOE EMPOWERS MINISTRY**

ZOE empowers orphaned children and youthled, vulnerable families to overcome poverty, move beyond charity, and experience meaningful lives.

Through a global network of local organizations, Zoe Empowers provides a scalable and sustainable framework in which vulnerable youth-led families are equipped to become safe and healthy, skilled for long-term success, and supported within their community to overcome the orphan crisis.

The Zoe Empowers model is distinctive and effective because of its focus on selfsufficiency to serve children to have stronger families. The goal is to not do anything for program participants that they could otherwise do for themselves.

Our approach has proven that orphans have the necessary gifts and abilities to overcome extreme poverty; they lack only opportunity and support. Once on the path toward selfsufficiency, every child becomes increasingly independent, quickly moving beyond the need for charity, both in the present and future.

For vulnerable youth, life revolves around survival. They quit school to find work. When \$1/ day doesn't feed their family, they beg, steal, or starve.

Exploited, abused and sick, they suffer in the shadows. Eventually, they lose hope, battling a cycle that is unfixable by relief-based aid or foster care systems that lack resources. We provide an opportunity for vulnerable youth to become self-sufficient. Lake Deaton currently sponsors five Empowerment Groups, each with 24 households and 85-100 children. Through this Art Extravaganza and donations, we hope to sponsor our sixth group! Through a threeyear, locally led program, vulnerable youth in Vizag, India will receive micro grants, life skills, and vocational training to become secure, healthy, and connected community members.

### **DISCERNING A CALL TO CARE.**

Many of you have caring hearts and a desire to love others as Jesus first loved us. If that describes you, I invite you to read the devotion, *Discerning a Call to Care*, shared at our most recent Congregational Care Ministry Training to pray for discernment and to consider if God is calling you to become a Congregational Care Minister.

Among the core values of Lake Deaton United Methodist Church is Caring: which states, "At the heart of our Christian experience is the call to care for each other. As such "we strive to place a high call on the care for our sisters and brothers in times of need in a way that creates a Christ-centered, Holy Spiritinspired, heart-felt experience of the presence of God. " (Romans 12:9-13) (1 Corinthians 3:16)

For the sake of time, I'll offer encouragement based on verses 12 and 13." Rejoice in our confident hope. Be patient in trouble, and keep on praying. When God's people are in need, be ready to help them. Always be eager to practice hospitality."

You likely have taken these verses to heart or you wouldn't be here this morning. Our confident hope is in Jesus Christ so our hope does not disappoint us. Jesus showed his great love and compassion through healing the sick and empowering His disciples also to go out to share the good news and bring God's healing touch and encouragement to those in need. It's

not always easy to be patient in times of trouble. It is in such times that we can also bring the comforting Word of God to people in times of distress and pray with and for them. The apostle Paul also invited his listeners to be ready to help God's people in need and always eager to practice hospitality.

Kenneth L. Carder, in his book, *Ministry with the Forgotten, in* speaking of how the mind plays a role in Christian theology stated, "When asked about the greatest commandment, Jesus responded, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." (Mattew 22:37).

Carder further directed people's attention to two prominent passages in the apostle Paul's letters where he advised, (Romans 12:2) "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." And from Philippians 2:5 "Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus."

Stephen Fowl suggested the use of "open mind" refers to one's way of being in the world, paying attention toward life and reality. Having "the mind that was in Christ Jesus" involves character—humility, servitude, obedience to God, "self-emptying." The reward of such a mind lies not in the capacities of the individual but from being "bestowed" value, a "name that is above every name."

In essence, our motivation to serve others comes from our relationship with Christ Jesus.

#### Let's Pray...

Gracious Lord, give us your wisdom and how You would have us to answer your call to serve You through serving others. Help us to be open to the teaching of your Word and Holy Spirit. Help us to listen and to learn more about how


